## Directions

**From the west via the turnpike:** Exit the PA turnpike at New Stanton (exit 75). Take Rt. 119 South 5 miles to Rt. 31 exit. Turn left onto Rt. 31 and follow east through Mt. Pleasant, to the village of Laurelville (4 miles). Turn left onto Rt. 982 North. The center is 3/4 mile north of the intersection and 1/4 miles of Rt. 982. Look for signs.

**From the East via the Turnpike:** Exit the Pa turnpike (Donegal Exit). Turn right and take Rt. 31 West to the village of Laurelville. Turn right onto Rt. 982 North The center is 3/4 mile North of the intersection, 1/4 mile off Rt. 982. Look for signs.

**From the West via I-70:** Exit I70 onto Rt. 119 South, to route 31 exit, turn left (East) and go through Mt. Pleasant to the village of Laurelville. At the intersection of Rt. 982 Turn left onto Rt. 982 North. The center is 3/4 mile North of the intersection, 1/4 mile off Rt. 982. Look for signs.

**David L. Delmonico, PhD**

Dr. David Delmonico is an Associate Professor at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Dr. Delmonico conducts research,

consultation, and training on topics such as cybersex, cyberoffense, and cyber-safety. Dr. Delmonico also lectures on topics such as general Internet psychology and sexually addictive and compulsive behaviors.

- Dr. Delmonico is co-author of *In the Shadows of the Net* and *Cybersex Unhooked*. He has published numerous scholarly articles on a variety of addiction and sexuality topics.
- Dr. Delmonico is Director of the Online Behavior Research and Education Center (OBREC) at Duquesne University and Editor-in-Chief of the *Sexual Addiction & Compulsivity* journal.

**John E. Wetzel, Secretary, Pennsylvania Department of Corrections**

John E. Wetzel was appointed by Gov. Tom Corbett as secretary of the Department of Corrections in December 2010. Secretary Wetzel has served as a correctional officer

(Lebanon County Correctional Facility), a treatment counselor, supervisor of treatment services and training academy director (Berks County Prison) and, in 2002, he was named warden of the Franklin County Jail. He was also appointed as the corrections expert to the Pennsylvania Board of Pardons in June 2007, a position he continues to hold. Since 2006, he has been a corrections consultant in the areas of operational and staffing analysis and vulnerability assessments. Wetzel is currently the immediate past president of the PA County Corrections Association (formerly PA County Prison Wardens Association).

Denise Bunner is a Psychological Services Specialist for the PA DOC at SCI-Albion. She currently coordinates the Sex Offender Therapeutic Community at Albion, which is an intensive sex offender therapeutic community program for those sex offenders who are considered a moderate to high level of risk. Denise has a Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology. Before joining the PA DOC, Denise served as an Offender and Family Therapist, as well as a Community Abuse Response Team member. In the latter role, she provided therapeutic assistance to family members affected by incest. In 2005, she was deployed to the Angola State Penitentiary, Louisiana to assist Social Workers attempting to locate family members of Parish prisoners displaced by Hurricane Katrina.
